She loves the element of surprise to every collage, not knowing what may get covered up or pulled off along the way. Every color and pattern of paper she places pulls her further into the story of each collage. That is where she finds the joy of her work.

Sarah has published illustration in Travel and Leisure magazine, among others and has also done promotional design and artwork for Warner Brothers Records and KPFK radio. She has recently shown work at the Mark Gruber Gallery in New Paltz, NY.
